The Chevra enjoyed a nice trip to the Shofar workshop! Since Rosh Hashanah is around the corner the Chevra went to make our very own shofars from scratch at the Chabad of the Upper East Side of Manhattan. We were also given lessons on how to blow it. **Rabbi Fried f**irst started by explaining to us that a shofar can be used from any kosher animal with horns except from a cow's horn. He also mentioned that the kosher animals have spilt feet and the only non-kosher animal that has spilt feet is the pig, which of course is not kosher. We happen to use a ram's horn. In order to make it a usable shofar we learned that there can't be any leaks or holes in it besides the top and bottom. The Shofar is then cleaned out by placing it in boiling water.

Afterwards, we thread a wire through the horn, cut the tip of the horn off and drilled a small hole through the top for the mouth piece. We were truly amazed about the process on a how a shofar is made. We finally had the chance to blow the shofar that we just made ourselves! Hearing the familiar sound coming from the shofar after all the work that was done making it was a rewarding experience. Rabbi Fried also reviewed with us the many customs for how to blow the shofar and how to position our mouth on the mouthpiece in order to generate the loud sound when we blow into it. The group really enjoyed the shofar workshop with Rabbi Fried. We are certain that when at shul on Rosh Hashanah, the guys experience will be enhanced because of this class. We all had a blast!

On Wednesday the Chevra went on our annual apple picking trip. This year we decided to change things up and visit a different farm. The farm that we went to is called Von Thun's Country Farms in North Brunswick NJ, where we hand-picked apples for Rosh Hashanah. The farm and the apple picking turned out to be very nice! Upon arriving at the farm, there was a nice picnic area. We sat down and ate our lunch that we packed with us prior to leaving. After our filling lunch, we each got our own apple bag and headed out to the apple fields at the farm and hand-picked our own juicy delicious apples. There were so many choices of different kinds of apples to choose from. It ranged from rows of yellow, multi- color, Macintosh, Gala, Golden Delicious and more. Our biggest problem was deciding which variety of apples to fill our bags with! As it is every year it was amazing to see all the rows of apple trees that seem to never end. Some of us literally picked an apple right off from the tree, made a Bracha and ate it all up (don't worry of course we asked permission and it was granted). The apples were delicious! Even though we can buy apples at our local grocery there is nothing like a crispy freshly picked apple right off the tree.
