It then proceeds to the admonition, a sobering account of warnings, punishments, frustrations and curses that will be the inevitable outcome of any attempt to destroy the covenant. Indeed, although Hashem prevents all of these cursers from befalling Israel in anyone unbearable instant, a careful reading of the Jewish history and perhaps in the 20th century in particular shows that they have taken place at various intervals, before and during the exiles. Just as the curses have come, however, so the final blessings will come, for the final words of the Admonition are Hashem's irrevocable oath that He will remember His covenant with the forefathers and redeem His children.

Tzvi W - "The country air and the whole Shabbos was so much Fun."




