
This week in review!

Vort on Parshas Vayeira:

Topic: The conclusion stems from the origin. "Let some water be taken and bath your feet, etc."

The Gemara teaches us that as a reward for the three deeds of Avroham, the Yehudim obtained three things.

(1) As a reward for offering milk and butter, they received manna. (2) As a reward for standing up to them they received the pillar of cloud. (3) As a reward for offering water, they were granted the well of Miriam. The Marsha asks: The Gemara elsewhere tells us that these three gifts were given in the merits of Moshe, Aharon and



Miriam and not in the merit of Avraham? The answer is that the gifts were the result of a process, not of a single event. Moshe, Aharon and Miriam were not the initial cause for the manna, cloud and drinking well. Rather, they watered and brought to fruition the seed planted by Avraham's hospitality. Similarly, we find the Mitzvah of Tzitzis attributed to the merit of both Shem and Avraham. Meaning:

Shem planted the "seed" by covering his father's shame and Avraham developed its fruition.

Just as a good deed has stages, similarly, wicked acts are to be seen as the result of a process. As the Ramban explains in one of the Pesukim: "Perhaps there is among you an evil root that will blossom and grow and in the coming days will produce poisonous buds"
